Notice is hereby given that the next meeting of the Australian Academy of Forensic Sciences (Victorian Chapter) will be held at the Office of Public Prosecutions, 565 Lonsdale Street, Melbourne commencing at 5:30pm (with light refreshments from 5:00pm) on **Wednesday 29 March 2017**.

Guest presenter Prof. James Ogloff will deliver a presentation on the topic of **Youth Crime and Violence**, including gangs.

James R. P. Ogloff AM is trained as a lawyer (JD) and psychologist (MA (Clin.Psych.), PhD). He is a Fellow of the Canadian, American, and Australian psychological societies as well as the International Association of Applied Psychology. He is the Foundation Professor of Forensic Behavioural Science and Director of the Centre for Forensic Behavioural Science at Swinburne University of Technology. He is also Director of Psychological Services and Research at the Victorian Institute of Forensic Mental Health (Forensicare). He has worked in clinical and forensic psychology in a variety of settings for 35 years.

Professor Ogloff has specific expertise in forensic psychology, forensic mental health, mental health law, and the assessment and management of offenders. He is the Past-President of the Australian and New Zealand Association of Psychiatry, Psychology and Law and a former Chair of the College of Forensic Psychologists of the Australian Psychological Society. He is a Past-President of the Canadian Psychological Association and a Past-President of the American Psychology-Law Society.

Professor Ogloff has published 17 books, more than 240 scholarly articles and multiple book chapters. In addition to his research and clinical work, Professor Ogloff regularly consults with the Victoria Police and is a member of the Australian Forensic Reference Group. He has also been a member of a number of boards and committees in the justice and mental health sectors in Victoria and New South Wales.

Professor Ogloff has conducted many reviews in justice and health involving matters such as murder by people on parole, suicide and deaths in custody, mental illness among Aboriginal prisoners, violence and aggression among young offenders, self-harm and suicide among immigration detainees, etc. He has been sought to give expert evidence to several Royal Commissions (e.g, family violence, black Saturday (arson), child sexual abuse, institutional abuse of children and child protection). His work has influenced case law and legislation across a number of areas of forensic psychology.
